But Masilonyane follows the old lady. His older brother goes too, as he doesn't want to be alone. The lady takes them to a magical farm and gives them some cows.


They leave the village happy, but thirsty too. Masilonyane offers to climb down a canyon

to get some water from the river below. Masilo is jealous of his brother's courage and decides to abandon him. He lets go of the rope and Masilonyane can't climb back up.


Masilo returns home alone. He thinks their parents will be happy because of the cows, but they're worried about Masilonyane. Masilo cries and confesses everything.






